**Art Beyond Sight Awareness Month** is an international initiative to promote art by and for people with vision loss and other disabilities, and to encourage multimodal approaches to art education and creativity.

Organized by Art Education for the Blind (AEB) and its more than 200 partners around the world, it recognizes that art education and exposure to the arts are crucial for the advancement of many key issues in the education and rehabilitation of people with vision loss and other disabilities.

Art making fosters sensory awareness, manual dexterity, self-confidence and self-awareness; for people with vision loss, art education and art-making activities also help to develop Braille-reading skills, mobility and map-reading skills, and tactile-exploration skills. All of these contribute significantly to a person's academic and professional success. In addition, being versed in and contributing to visual culture helps people with disabilities break through social barriers and enhances their full participation in the world.
