POLAR VISION: SEEING BEYOND LIMITS

In late 2003 Alan Lock began to suffer from Macular Degeneration, which rapidly destroyed much of his vision and cost him his military career. Despite this, Alan has completed ten marathons including the 151-mile Marathon Des Sables in the Sahara Desert. In 2008, Alan set a Guinness World Record and raised over \$80,000 for charity when he became the first visually impaired person to row across the Atlantic Ocean. Most recently, he and two colleagues, Richard Smith and Andrew Jensen, decided to take on one of the toughest endurance challenges in the world: to trek, unsupported, from the coast of Antarctica all the way to the South Pole. They are calling this endeavor Polar Vision. The British-American team will cover a distance of nearly 600 miles, expending over 7,000 calories per day and taking on one of the harshest environments on the planet. In a recent phone interview with ABS, Alan shared some for his experiences in museums across the world.

"When it comes to museums, I am a typical guy with an engineering background. I prefer history and science museums to art galleries. I like big machines and the history behind them. I love boats, so I very much enjoyed the USS Pampanito, a submarine museum in San Francisco, and HMS *Belfast*, a museum ship, operated by the Imperial War Museum in London.

"As a kid I liked building things and enjoyed handling objects in museums. More generally, I enjoy museum experiences that include objects that could be handled or manipulated especially since now my vision does not allow me to see the objects as well. I went to a science museum in Japan recently, and was fascinated by its hands-on robotics exhibits that allowed visitors to control these devices. California aquariums were also really fun as water magnifies everything 33%, and there were touchable objects as well.

"Strolling through San Francisco Botanical gardens, and exploring Yosemite and other national parks is one of my and my wife's Esther favorite pass times. She often reads the signage for me."
